Dear Friends

In January 2012, I was very fortunate to become the Executive Director of this vibrant special needs community. It has been exhilarating, stimulating, inspiring and challenging. From my first association with Riverside Foundation from 1978-1988, when I was hired to direct a group of 5 program staff, I have seen the agency grow into a residential community where over 85 program staff now teach, guide, and counsel 97 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities at the residential and the work activity site in Vernon Hills, IL.



This is a community that thrives on relationships where you can see residents, staff, family members, and volunteers alike caring *about* and caring *for* each other on a daily basis. Over half of the individuals who live at Riverside Foundation have lived here for over twenty years and have developed or enriched relationships with their peers that will last an entire lifetime. Many staff members have worked with the residents for more than ten years and have, as well, developed lasting relationships with both residents and their colleagues. Our relationships with resident's guardians and other family members - and with the volunteers who provide countless hours of advocacy, companionship, leadership teaching and enjoyment are both important and meaningful to each individual. It is in this setting that people make new friends and develop relationships that last a lifetime.

Our relationship with the Board of Directors and the surrounding community has fostered a friendship that continually helps us fulfill our mission to provide quality services and support to our residents and clients in a healthy, safe and caring environment. The Board is the governing body of the agency comprised of community and business leaders and is an integral part of our continued success. Should you have an interest in serving on the Board, please contact me. We are blessed to be part of a community that embraces our mission and understands our importance.

Support from the community at large is paramount to enabling us to continue to provide quality services and experiences to everyone we serve. While we have accomplished many goals this year, Riverside has been increasingly challenged with significant cuts in state funding. The elimination of payments for bed holds -when residents are on home visits, in the hospital or on vacation with families- has resulted in an annual decrease of \$250,000. As well, the transfer of dental costs from the Medicaid Program to our responsibility has been trying.

With the help from our Auxiliary, volunteers, families and guardians and the community we have not only met our goals, but have:

- expanded computer training for our residents
- developed a gardening club for residents
- increased exercise equipment and participation in the exercise program
- added a sensory room dedicated to providing a relaxing and calming sensory experience for our residents
- identified and added a certified nursing assistant to better meet resident medical needs
- purchased new bedroom furniture

There are many ways you can get involved with us: direct volunteering with residents and clients, attending fundraisers supporting our work, joining our wonderful Riverside Foundation Auxiliary, assisting us in finding paid work for everyone at Riverside Work and Activity Center. As you read through our 2012 Annual Report, please consider what role might fit you if you are not already an active supporter. As with all of us, our friendships and community involvement enriches our lives and makes us who we are. On behalf of the Riverside community we welcome your interest and participation.

Our Community

The Riverside Foundation is a not-for-profit, community based organization serving adults with moderate to severe intellectual and developmental disabilities through the provision of high-quality residential care and individualized developmental training services.

Since 1976, Riverside Foundation has provided a home and support services to more than 400 adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Through the Riverside Foundation Work and Activity Center (RWA) located in Vernon Hills, Illinois, we have provided opportunities for our residents and other adults with developmental disabilities in our area to develop skills and assume responsibilities for real-life work.

The Riverside Foundation is a member of the Greater Lincolnshire Chamber of Commerce and the Green Oaks, Libertyville, Mundelein and Vernon Hills Area Chamber of Commerce. Funding for our programs and services is provided by the Illinois Department of Human Services and through donations from individuals, businesses and community organizations.

The Riverside Foundation does not discriminate against anyone due to race, creed or color, in providing its programs. The agency is licensed by the Illinois Department of Public Health and is certified by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as an Intermediate Care Facility for Adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. The Riverside Foundation Work and Activity Center (RWA) is licensed by the State and the U.S. Departments of Labor as a Work Activity Center and is certified by the Illinois Department of Human Services as a Developmental Training Program.

Each year Stevenson students host numerous dances and events for Riverside Foundation. All of the events that the student volunteers provide quickly become favorites of our residents. The past several years, Riverside has been one of several recipients to benefit from the Stevenson Project Dance charity. This year nearly 1,000 students participated in Project Dance and raised over \$25,000 for the agency.

Boy Scouts – Northwest Council of Illinois

The Boy Scouts visit our residence monthly and are directly involved with our residents. From fishing, outdoor sports and even a Pine Wood Derby, the Boy Scouts and our residents both experience a great learning opportunity.

Camp Red Leaf (CRL)

This program is run by the Jewish Council for Youth Services. This past summer over 25 of our residents attended CRL for a week. Campfires, swimming, boating and much more, made camping memories for them and stories of summer camp that will last a long time.

Center for Enriched Living (CEL)

CEL is an agency in Northbrook that provides programs for some of our residents including, cooking, board games, current events and community outings. Currently, several of our residents are involved in CEL's Sunday afternoon programs.

Lincolnshire Animal Hospital

This volunteer group brings their trained therapy dogs to Riverside several times a month. Spending time with these wonderful four legged friends brings a smile to every face. This program brings a lot of excitement and is cherished by all who participate.

Lincolnshire Garden Club

Every spring brings fresh beginnings and it's no different at Riverside. The Lincolnshire Garden Club provides the funds and brings the additional helpful labor to our grounds and works with our residents to beautify Riverside. Our residents love to get involved with the planting and enjoy helping make the grounds lush and colorful. This year our residents, along with the Lincolnshire Garden Club, planted a vegetable garden that produced tomatoes, cucumbers, green peppers and even pumpkins.

Special Recreation Association of Central Lake County (SRACLIC)

SRACLIC offers one-time special events and ongoing programs designed for individuals with disabilities. Through the Village of Lincolnshire, a continuing SRACLIC community member, Riverside is able to pay in-district fees for programs and events such as, cheerleading, bowling, crafting, acting in plays, bocce ball and more. These programs are offered year-round and are favorites of our residents.

Volunteers

Riverside has over 50 volunteers who bring a special touch of happiness and warmth to all of our residents. For those residents who do not have family contact our volunteers provide companionship, special outings and celebrations on special days. Other volunteers provide craft programs, special activities or serve on the Human Rights Committee or Resident Council. Volunteers bring a special touch to Riverside and we are very grateful for each and every one of them.

Residential Services

The Riverside Foundation residential facility located in Lincolnshire was founded in 1976 and currently provides services to 97 adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Our program is committed to providing each member of our community with a learning environment built upon the concept of individualization according to each member's assessed strengths and needs. These services include professional intake, assessment, supervisory services, individualized habilitation plans, structured activities designed to increase functional independence and 24 hour a day nursing support. The program integrates social services, recreation, specialized therapies and medical services to meet the physical, psychological and emotional challenges facing our residents.

Our residents have the opportunity to participate in a broad range of programs that are designed to enhance development and independence as well as adding enjoyment and experiences to their lives. Some of their favorite programs include: Pet Therapy offered by the Lincolnshire Animal Hospital, Music Therapy, Art Therapy and Yoga practice. Also, a special social skills program called Circles, is providing training in appropriate interactions with others.

Community Outings are an integral part of the education and recreational program at Riverside. Small groups of residents complete their banking at Baxter Credit Union, wash their clothes at a local laundromat and shop at many stores in the area. This past year the residents enjoyed trips to the zoo, forest preserve walks, various local village fairs, trips to the movies and many dinner outings. They also enjoyed monthly shows at the Marriott Lincolnshire Theater.

Riverside Work and Activity Center

The name of our pre-vocational center changed this past year from Riverside Developmental Services to Riverside Foundation Work and Activity Center (RWA). The name was changed to be more descriptive of the activities at RWA. We continue to provide daily services for our residents, some of the residents who reside at Mt. St. Joseph in Lake Zurich, IL and a small number of individuals who reside at home.

RWA provides a pre-vocational work environment designed to teach functional independence, good work habits and specific job skills. The clients are able to complete business tasks such as light packaging, assembly, inserting, labeling, collating, mailing and product rework. This past year has been challenging as work contracts have decreased in conjunction with the overall decline in the economy. While contract work has declined clients continue to be engaged in other purposeful activities. Our RWA staff is currently working on innovative ways to not only solicit more business contracts, but to create our own products and services to make available to the community.
